Lots Happening to Kick-Off 2025 in Independence Township



GRANTS, GRANTS, and MORE GRANTS! Over HALFAMILLION Dollars Awarded in last few months!







tarting into an eventful year, in just a few months time, Independence Township has been awarded over HALF A MILLION DOLLARS in grant money! Whenever we have projects that fit the criteria for available grants, we will apply, in effort to bring resources and opportunities here for our people. This is money that if it did not come here, would go somewhere else!

Late in January, the Washington County LSA awarded Independence Township with a \$200,000 grant to continue renovations on the former Lincoln National Bank in our downtown village.


There are big ideas for this beautiful historic building. Ideas that can bring aesthetic beauty, business, visitors and life into our downtown village. This is a positive thing for our whole community. The LSA helps distribute portions of gambling revenue. This year 119 applications were submitted, and we were one of 68 applicants to receive a piece. There is other gambling revenue used for other things in PA, but this money is earmarked by the state specifically for these types of community development projects. Our thanks goes to David Noss from RSH Architects for the presentation given to the LSA committee, which resulted in the determination that our township and our project was worthy of the \$200,000 grant.

Another big, exciting grant award announcement came in at the beginning of 2025 from Pennsylvania Greenways, Trails, and Recreation Program (DCED Project). We learned that another one of our grant applications had been awarded; \$125,000 to create the large trail at Independence Township Community Park as a part of Phase IV of the Park's overall plans. It will open up more area of the park and will be another nice step forward in the development. Our park was not so long ago predominantly unused wooded area. It has developed into a beautiful community park, with amenities and features being added as funding is secured in the way of grants and donations. It is enjoyed by many, and even for those who do not utilize the park, it's existence has increased surrounding property values.

Late in 2024, our Public Works department received word that we had been awarded \$96,100 for needed repairs on Narigon Run Road and then \$99,200 for needed repairs on Hickory Nut Road. See page 8 for more info about these grants. This February, we also received good news that the previously awarded \$100,000+ grant from the WCCD to fix issues on Sugar Run had been increased an additional \$20,000 to add-in some needed **structure**. Roadmaster Bob Collett said the planning, engineering and permitting sometimes takes a while on these projects, but he believes we'll see this project start to move soon. We'll be seeing movement on the others in the near future as well. Follow us on Facebook, as we will keep everyone updated on road closures/detours/etc.

We are grateful for the government agencies, committees and organizations who are investing in our township through these grants. We believe putting this money into our municipality can help bring new opportunities for our residents now and in the future. We have other grant applications out and in the works for a variety of things, including blight (abandoned properties/ hazards/eyesores), DCNR grants for additional land clearing at the park, grants for improvements at the Community Center, grants for street-scaping downtown, for PA-250 Celebrations, and more.

Welcoming our New Supervisor

New Independence Township Supervisor,

Mr. Ed Powers was appointed in the December public Township meeting by the board. As we interviewed Ed and dug into his thoughts about Independence Township and his background, it became evident that he comes equipped with an overflowing toolbox to be an excellent successor here.

What Sets Ed Apart?

In his profession, he's rose the ranks from a life-saving paramedic to a strong leader in charge of big business decisions and logistics in disaster response and crisis situations. His education and professional background are impressive, but maybe most importantly of all, our new Supervisor, Mr. Ed Powers, has a special heart for his hometown and our people. Ed's late father instilled in Ed the importance of serving others; to get up everyday to try and make a positive impact on the world and people around him. Ed says "What a different world we would live in if everyone approached life that way." Powers told the attendees of the December meeting that "my Dad is smiling down on me today," because his own father wanted to be an Independence Township supervisor at

Ed has lived and served here the majority of his life, so he is familiar with what makes us tick, our strengths and weaknesses. He's served as a volunteer in the Avella Volunteer Fire Department since age 14 (41 years), and he credits them for a lot, including opening the door to his profession. He also serves as the Clerk of Sessions (Leader of Elders) at Avella Church, where that isn't just a title for him. Ed is a man of faith, and he isn't afraid to share that faith. partnerships, and improving conditions and morale for employees. Mr. Powers currently serves as the Regional Director for Global Medical Response, the nation's largest Emergency Medical Provider. He holds an MBA in financial management, a bachelor's degree in criminal justice, and he's a certified paramedic. Ed still rides part-time Paramedic to keep up with his life saving skills.'

As a member of the Avella Volunteer Fire Department and head of Independence Township's Emergency Management Department, Ed, along with other first responders, quickly answered a life-threatening medical emergency call late one night in February. It resulted in having the patient air lifted. Independence Township is grateful for our first responders and our thoughts and sincerest well wishes go to the ones affected by this emergency.





Ed has lots of shocking pictures from his work in disaster response. Like many first responders, he goes in when most people are fleeing. Ed said he often times meets people and patients on their worst days. Here are just a couple of photos of the devastation they saw during a Florida Hurricane response. After dealing with these high-pressure situations, there's no doubt Ed can add to the level-headed, cool & steady leadership here in Independence Township.

2222? Questions for Ed

What are your hopes for making this as smooth a transition as possible?

"To learn as much as I can, to ask questions...
Anywhere I go, I like to dig in and get to know people, learn their challenges first hand and figure out what I can do to support them and make things better for them...to see the real life challenges they face in their day-to-day, so we can come up with real life solutions that will actually improve things... And I always try to be fair and consistent."

As you takeover as supervisor, in your opinion what is the state of Independence Township?

"Being new to the Township Supervisor position, I have a lot to learn. It's been interesting so far, learning so far what everyone at the Township does."

Why do you feel is service to the community so important?

Getting involved beyond your day-to-day job to serve and volunteer as a community...It's why we're here. To love God and love our neighbors. When we serve each other, alongside one another, and work with other people to achieve goals, we share experiences and we make things better.

► WINTER WEATHER!

December and January blasted our region with real winter snow accumulations and some extreme cold. It resulted in more than usual active snow days for Independence Township Public Works Department. Some mornings you will find our crew up at 3am-4am, loading trucks with salt and anti-skid to get plowing and treating roads early, to keep our (approx.) 34 miles of township roads as safe as possible for school buses and commuters. Some days the snow just kept coming, and it kept our guys out for long hours. We're very proud of the job they do, and we appreciate how their hard work was recognized on social media and in-person praises by many. Along with taking care of the roads, our crew also assisted stuck motorists, kept materials stocked, and maintained and fixed equipment. Roadmaster Bob Collett said already this winter, they've gone through and replaced around 250 ton of salt and anti-skid (normally it would take a few years to go through this much), and having the

storage building behind the community center this year was key. Some townships ran out of their material, and we did not, because of that extra storage.

A big part of Public Works is maintaining their heavily used trucks and pieces of equipment. There's always something that needs repaired, cleaned, inspected, replaced, painted, etc. Sometimes small. quick fixes, sometimes large and expensive. Most times our skilled crew (Bob Collett, Joe Gagliani and Donny Riggans) performs these duties in-house to keep costs low. Roadmaster Bob Collett said right now the 35 year old, 1990 John Deere Wheel Loader is in need of repair. It is used to load trucks with material. It is important to have a good working wheel loader for salt and anti-skid, but also particularly for tar & chip, because time is very much of the essence during that operation, and a slow, dysfunctional loader can push back the whole operation (a co-op involving other townships) and cause issues with the material and the entire project.

► GRANTS AWARDED. **MONEY COMING IN!**

We were recently awarded two big grants needed to fix two big road issues on Narigon Run and Hickory Nut Roads. Money has started coming in, allowing the projects move forward. Roadmaster Bob had completed a class that allowed Independence Township to be eligible for these grants, then applied for them. Both grants will allow us to make permanent repairs to areas of township roads with major ongoing stormwater problems that have repetitively costed money to make smaller repairs after significant rain events over the past years. It will save the township a lot of money going forward!

Get to Know Your New Tax Collector

You're probably well aware by now...

that Ms. Judy Magon is our newly appointed Tax Collector, after longtime Tax Collector and Deputy, Tom and Karen Simons, resigned in 2024. Judy told us that they've been very gracious in the transition, essentially handing the reins over to Judy after deciding it was time for them to retire, and being very helpful in answering questions thereafter. The board of supervisors believed Judy would be an excellent successor and officially appointed her on February 2, 2024.

A Dashed Dream of 30 Years **Comes Full Circle!**

Judy shared her story, and how she's had the desire to serve as your tax collector for over 30 years! In 1993, Ms. Magon ran against

Tom Simons, when her son Jared was just two years old. Eager to fill the role, she campaigned hard but lost the race, however marginally. She ran one other time but lost, and out of respect for Tom, chose not to run again. She kept in touch with Tom, and asked him to inform her if he ever decided not to run for re-election. So Judy continued to work as a full time dental hygienist, and now, 30 years later, circumstances have come full circle. Judy said "it's funny how things turn out." Currently she's loving the role of Independence Township Tax Collector, she's contemplating retirement in the very near future, and she's excited about her very first grandchild who is due in the Spring. It all sort-of fits just perfectly.

A self-described workaholic, Judy has a background in business and working with the public. She loves the job of tax collection, bookkeeping, and working with the residents of Independence Township. Judy says that simply being honest with people is important to her, and if someone has a question she doesn't know the answer to, she will track it down. She is not afraid to ask questions herself. Her brother, John Roadman is her Deputy Tax Collector. He is an accountant for Silgan Plastic and has been instrumental with advice. She's also made countless trips to the courthouse, and the director of operations in the tax revenue office there has been a helpful contact when she has questions.



Deep Roots in Independence

Ms. Magon has deep roots in Independence Township. She has resided here her whole life, graduated from Avella High School in '76, was married here and raised her son Jared here. Both of her parents, Bob and Leala Roadman, and all of her grandparents were Independence Township residents. Her Dad's parents owned the old Sunoco Gas Station at the corner of Rt. 844 and Rt. 50. Her Mother's parents owned a dairy farm on Indian Camp. Judy grew up with four brothers, and they all attended grade school in the same building that is now the Independence Township Community Center. Judy remembers her parents instilling a hard work ethic into her and her brothers, as her parents wanted all of them to have higher educations and be achievers... and they are! Through the District we help local citizens manage these important resources by demonstrating proper farm practices, providing technical assistance to landowners, issuing permits, and following regulations. The District also hosts many educational events and workshops for county residents to join and receive resources.







THE WILY COYOTE Mating Season & Huntin



INFORMATION PROVIDED BY **Andrew Kopec**, State Game Warden (serving Independence Township)

The Eastern Covote stirs a lot of interest and intrigue. Seeing or hearing its howl is a reward to some. For others it may send a shiver down the spine. Many sportsman and farmers dislike it because of coyote predation. Trappers and hunters find it to be elusive.

PA State Game Warden Andrew Kopec covers Independence Township, and he gave us some interesting info, sharing that their mating season is now (January-February). Because of that, coyotes may be more chatty and more visible, but Andrew said folks out here in the country know how to deal with wildlife and they really don't have many issues. In his experience, it's in the springtime (when farmers are calving and lambing), that they'll get a rare call out our way about an unfortunate coyote encounter with a small or young

farm animal. This is the time of year when hunters may find more success with coyotes. During this season, their pelts are at their healthiest. Some of our hunters around here get cabin fever, with no other hunting in-season, so they will go out for coyotes.

Andrew said, from his observation, their population seems to be stable, and he sees no indication of overpopulation. The Game Commission website states that "despite man's attempt to control [coyotes]... If there's one thing we have learned about this intriguing animal, it's that the coyote, not man, controls the coyote's destiny." Interestingly, other local sportsmen have noted that indeed, covotes re-populate their packs with increased litter sizes and pregnancy rates after heavy trapping and hunting pressures.







INTERESTING FACTS

- Coyotes are monogamous. They maintain bonds for several years.
- Males weigh up to 55 lbs. Females up to 40 lbs.
- 🔖 Litters of 5-7 pups are born from mid-April early May.
- Coyotes compensate for unusually high mortality by having larger litters.
- Known denning sites include overturned trees, piles of tree stumps, rock dens, and dug-out red-fox dens

- During most of the year coyotes may be hunted with only a general license, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- 🕓 During any open big game season (e.g., deer season), you will need to have a furtaker's license.
- Hunting often done in groups at twilight or night hours, with use of thermal, night vision, spot light. They are called in and sometimes dogs are used.


